Team works!

African-German Youth Office (AGYO) Intergenerational, intercultural and international

Since 2021, we have been a partner of the African-German Youth Office (AGYO) for the programme line Team works! Young Expert Exchange for Sustainable Development – a programme aimed at young professionals who want to gain work experience abroad, that is funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).

With Team works! we bring young professionals from the African continent to Germany for internships lasting several weeks and, vice versa, send young professionals from Germany to African countries. Here and there, we provide voluntary mentors. The focus of the work shadowing programme is on the professional framework with which we enable the young generation to gain new perspectives: How does my job work in another country? What experiences can I share? What can I learn?

We are convinced of our offer and notice the great commitment of the participants. But after almost five years, it's worth having someone from outside take a look: thus, last year, we welcomed the Institute for Social Research, Consultancy and Organisational Development (iSPO), which evaluated our activities as part of Team works!

And the results are impressive! The entire AGYO performed excellently, and we were also able to prove ourselves as a partner for Team works! This is what the final report says:

'The strengths that SES brings to the AGYO make it a suitable partner for the programme line: the professional expertise, the large network of volunteer senior experts, the global network of contacts to companies, extensive experience and expertise with assignments abroad and its own international structure.'

as a member of the concept team, I still know Team works! from the time when the idea was first conceived and gradually came to fruition. It goes without saying that this small and fine programme with its great potential is still very close to my heart today.

With our partnership with the African-German Youth Office (AGYO), we have significantly expanded the range of our activities: we now have another programme for the younger generation and are also in a position not only to send experts abroad, but to bring them to Germany for internships – a plus for the dynamics of knowledge transfer.

Team works! is international and intercultural – and thanks to the successful implementation of the tandem format, in which a young expert is always accompanied by one of our senior experts, it is also intergenerational.

In addition to the dialogue between cultures, the meeting of different generations is a particular concern for us in times of demographic change. Strengthened by the results of the evaluation commissioned by the AGYO, we are looking forward to the next years with Team works!

I learnt a lot. For example, that the requirements for clothing, its style and quality are different everywhere and that you can influence your commercial success by analysing the market and customers. But also that everyone has different ways and times of working. Overall, I gained a good insight into how the clothing industry in Zimbabwe and the mass production of goods works. But the most important thing I learnt was that people need to be treated well in order to create a productive working atmosphere.

For Anna, it was a good opportunity to familiarise herself with the reality of a company and to try out how she can apply her theoretical knowledge to the situation. Exposure to a different culture promotes young people's understanding of other points of view and tolerant behaviour as well as social skills – things that companies like to see in their employees. And the companies? They receive an assessment and evaluation from an 'outside perspective'. New and fresh perspectives never hurt and also broaden the horizons of the people working in the companies.

I decided in favour of Team works! and the AGYO because I liked the idea of having an expert from SES as a mentor to accompany me during my stay abroad in my new environment.

<u>Kelvin Kweka</u>, a graphic designer from Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, interned at a marketing agency in Bad Neuenahr-Ahrweiler in 2023. He was accompanied by our expert Dr Helmut Zell.

As a young expert who is still at the beginning of his career, I wanted to do an internship in Germany with Team works! from AGYO to use my expertise for the common goal of promoting sustainable development. I was very happy to learn from the experts in the programme and was able to bring the knowledge I gained to my current job to initiate long-term sustainable projects.







I have been interested in medical work in the Global South since I was a teenager. After the paediatric surgeon at my work drew my attention to the programme, I looked into Team works! Not least because of my own African roots in the Democratic Republic of Congo, I decided to do an internship with AGYO.

<u>Gradine Mbaya</u>, surgical assistant, interned internship the paediatric surgery department of a hospital in Nyangao, Tanzania, in 2023. She accompanied our expert Dr Gabriele Krawzak.

After my apprenticeship as a carpenter, I really wanted to go abroad one day and use my skills there – to get out of Germany for a change. After a lot of research and information, I came across the AGYO. I thought the programme sounded really exciting and will give me the opportunity to pass on my knowledge and help others.


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An invitation that we gladly accepted
